Altar Servers are expected to arrive ten minutes before Mass starts to set up, and to find a substitute whenever a scheduling conflict arises.

Sunday Vespers: Evening Prayer from The Liturgy of the Hours

Description: Join the clergy, the religious, and the devout laity throughout the world in offering praise and thanksgiving to God our Father through his Son, Jesus Christ, in Hymns, Psalms, Antiphons, and Canticles from Sacred Scripture at 5:30 p.m. each Sunday in the Upper Church. Duration is about 30 minutes.

Needs/Opportunities: Need one or two regulars to back up the Coordinator. An opportunity to participate in the Official Prayer of the Church, the Divine Office, in conformance with the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*: "Pastors of souls should see to it that the principal hours, especially Vespers, are celebrated in common in church on Sundays and on the more solemn feasts. The laity, too, are encouraged to recite the divine office, either with the priests, or among themselves, or even individually." Can't make it to the Church? Get online access using the link to eBreviary or St. Thomas More House of Prayer. Evening Prayer for Sunday is free at eBreviary, and can be printed as a booklet.

Commitment required: In his First Letter to the Thessalonians, St. Paul advises us to pray without ceasing. Also, please read the *General Instruction for the Liturgy of the Hours* (available online through the website).

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion

Description: Eucharistic Ministers are those parishioners of St. Maurice who assist in the distribution of the Eucharist during Mass. They are devout in their faith of the living presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, and are practicing Catholics. Training is required and is provided by the coordinator of this ministry, with use of educational videos provided by the Diocese of Norwich.

Needs/Opportunities: Serving as an Extraordinary Eucharistic Minister offers the opportunity to deepen one's spiritual life and to participate more fully of Jesus' mission of reaching out and bringing the faith community to God's table.

Commitment Required: The Eucharistic Minister is assigned a Mass time of his/her choosing and is placed on a schedule that includes a phone number where he or she can be reached. Serving at Mass works out to be about twice a month. In addition to serving at Mass, the Eucharistic Minister may wish to bring Holy Communion to the sick/homebound of the parish.

Ministry to the Sick: Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion to the Sick/Shut-ins in Home or Hospital

Description: Extraordinary Eucharistic Ministers to the Sick/Shut-ins are those parishioners who distribute the Eucharist to those members of our community who are homebound due to short-term or chronic illness, age or disability. These ministers may also be called upon to bring the Eucharist to parishioners in local convalescent homes or hospitals. Training is required and is provided by shadowing an experienced minister, and through educational videos provided by the Diocese of Norwich.

Needs/Opportunities: The Extraordinary Eucharistic minister brings the healing and sacramental presence of the Eucharistic Christ, and acts as an extension of the faith community to those who cannot come to Mass. Those persons with a desire and love for the Eucharist, and a desire to share this love with the homebound, are encouraged to participate in this ministry.

Commitment required: Eucharistic Ministers generally bring Holy Communion to the Sick/Shut-ins weekly or biweekly; however, it is possible to serve on an "as needed" basis.

Description: The minister of the Word proclaims the living word of God to the community at Eucharistic liturgies, and at other liturgical services.

Needs/Opportunities: Persons who possess a deep faith in and love for the word of God, and the skills necessary to proclaim God's word with clarity and conviction.

Commitment required: Commitment to seriously prepare for proclaiming God's word by praying with and studying the Scriptures, availability to minister approximately once every four or five weeks, and to arrive ten to fifteen minutes before the service for preparation.

Description: Part of the Diocesan preparation for marriage is a Pre-Cana course. One of the ways to meet this requirement is five 1-2 hour sessions with a couple here in the parish. This is a course in communication between the newly engaged couple and a married couple to help guide them through these sessions covering a variety of subjects that are important within a marriage. There is a text to help.

Needs/Opportunities: The need is a willingness to help prepare couples for marriage. This course also provides the married couple an opportunity to review their own marriage, sharing some of the positive techniques of communication you have learned over the years.

Commitment required: There are few marriages at St. Maurice. You may have to prepare one couple per year, rarely more. The session times you arrange directly with the Pre-Cana couple.

Commitment required: This varies according to the number of Baptisms on request. Any assistance to the Coordinator is gratefully welcomed.

Description: Ushers are to be considered the official greeters of all who come for services. They establish the tone or spirit of the community as it gathers for worship. Ushers perform an important function or role in the orderly progress of the liturgy. They are responsible for general good order in the church, for assistance at seating as needed, for the selection of a family or individuals for the offertory procession, for the collection of the people's offerings, usher people out into the communion procession and pass out bulletins, etc. at the conclusion of Mass.

Needs/Opportunities: All adults, including older teenagers, are welcomed to assist in providing this important liturgical function. No special training or skills are required; however, guidance from current, experienced ushers is always available. This is an excellent opportunity to meet and get to know your fellow worshipers.

Commitment required: The usher group is organized into teams. Four or more per team and four teams per Mass, therefore, each team is scheduled for duty approximately once a month.

SCHOLARSHIP MINISTRIES

Faith Formation: Religious Education for Youth

Description: The purpose of the Faith Formation program at St. Maurice is to instruct young people in the beliefs and practice of the faith, prepare them to receive the sacraments, promote Christian fellowship among them, encourage them in service to the community, and develop vocations.

Needs/Opportunities: If you have received Confirmation you are eligible to be a teacher. We have five or six classrooms of students, and we need two adults in each room to comply with Safe Environments. Training will be provided both on the job and at sessions of adult faith formation.

Commitment required: About 20 classes per year on Sunday mornings for an hour-and-a-half before 10:00 Mass, a session of Safe Environments training plus required forms and background checks, and training at most once per year.

Telephone network must have the ability and TIME to make calls for donations and report back in a timely manner. Donors of food items must make a commitment to follow through on their donations and for the prompt delivery of food donated. The success of every reception is based on their donations.
