OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST THE KING

2 Sm 5:1-3 / Col 1:12-20 / Lk 23:35-43

Today we celebrate Our Lord Jesus Christ the King. He doesn't look like a king to the people around him. The inscription Pilate put over Jesus' head was designed to be sarcastic, to create a laugh. Jesus announced that the kingdom of God was at hand. The Roman executioners taunted him—fine, have your kingdom right here on this wood. And so he did.

There was no way Roman crucifixion could mean anything but defeat. Jesus was hung on the cross, cursed by the law, left to die with his vision of a "reign of God." The gibbet was a place of shame. Isn't a king supposed to know triumph? But he did.

What does a condemned criminal think about in his last hours? To one side, Jesus hears a voice that condemns him again: "Why don't you help? Are you the Messiah?" (What had this man heard? Had he ever hoped Jesus was able to save?) But from another cross, we hear a dying man speak with prophetic insight. He trusts Jesus. He asks Jesus to remember him. And he will.

In the clouded scene on Calvary Hill, we see the mixture of light and darkness that surrounded Jesus through his life, came to his trial, and accompanied his death.

But we celebrate him as King today, because in him God "delivered us from the power of darkness and transferred us to the kingdom of his beloved Son in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins."

He is risen from the dead.

May the grace and peace of our Savior be with you! Dan Finucane

ADVENT ACTIVITY

Travel Tips from the Magi



Christmas seems to come earlier each year, with parties scheduled, music played and even presents exchanged long before December 25. But if modern scholars are right, the Magi must have set out long before

Jesus was born in order to find him at this birth. These wise travelers have something to say to us about how we go through Advent on our way to Christmas.

- 1. **KEEP A LARGE FOCUS.** The Magi were led by a heavenly phenomenon, and by keeping their eyes on it, they found Jesus. Our focus this Advent also has to be something greater than can be found in any mall or website or video. It has to be something like God in our midst.
- 2. TRIM DOWN FOR THE TRIP. The Magi could only take what would fit on their camels, so most of what they had was left behind. Advent is the time to leave behind anything that could slow us down: grudges, unrealistic expectations, unfair demands and, most of all sins leave them with God in the confessional, and you'll speed along toward Christmas.
- 3. **TRAVEL TOGETHER.** One of the Magi traveling alone would never have made it. They needed each other for support and encouragement while they puzzled out the best way to go. Together with the whole Church, especially in the weekly liturgy, we encounter God concretely in our lives.
- 4. **BE PEOPLE OF HOPE.** Hope kept the Magi going. Many had seen the star, but only three risked everything to find the king. To overcome discouragement, the skepticism of others and uncertainty, Christians need hope to make their Advent journey to Christmas and beyond. © 2010 Creative Communications for the Parish


