# dear Padr Should we wear liturgical colors to Mass?

My pastor encourages us to wear liturgical colors to Mass: green for Ordinary Time, violet during Advent, red on the feast days of martyrs, and so forth. None of my friends have ever heard of such a thing. Is this something we're all supposed to be doing?

### Dear Marilyn,

The color of the priests' vestments are dictated by the feasts and liturgical seasons (Advent, Christmas, Lent, Easter, and Ordinary Time) of the Church year. The colors are listed in the liturgical calendar published by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. This Tuesday, for example, the vestments will be red because Saint Andrew was a martyr. Saint Francis Xavier was not, so the vestments worn for his memorial this Friday will be white.

Paragraphs 345-347 of the General Instruction of the Roman Missal explain when and why each color is worn (usccb.org/liturgy/current/GIRM.pdf).

I've never heard of the folks in the pews dressing to match the color of the priest's Mass vestments. Today is the First Sunday of Advent, so he's wearing violet vestments. There certainly isn't anything wrong with the assembly's dressing to match, but the Church doesn't require it.

Outside these doors it is the shopping season as well as the Advent season, but sometimes Advent gets lost in all the hustle and bustle. Wearing something violet as you shop would be a lovely personal reminder of the true meaning of the season.

One of the most enduring symbols of the season, the **Advent Wreath**, brings together several power images:

- The circular wreath reminds us that God's love for us has no beginning and no end.
- The **evergreen sprigs** often added to the wreath call to mind the eternal life God offers us in Jesus.
- The four **candles** mark the four weeks of Advent. Three candles are **purple**, the color of repentance, reminding us why we need a Savior in the first place. The one **pink** candle is a sign of joy, even in the midst of waiting. As we light another candle each week, **light** increasingly dispels darkness, just as the Light of Christ overcomes the darkness of sin and death in our lives.

The **Advent Calendar** marks the passage of time in a concrete way.

*O Come, O Come, Emmanuel* is perhaps the best known **Advent hymn**. Its haunting melody dates from ninth-century France. Each verse is based on one of the "O Antiphons," parts of the Church's evening prayer that are drawn from the Wisdom literature of the Old Testament. © 2010 Creative Communications for the Parish
