# dear Padre hat are ember days

Do Catholics still observe ember days? I've never heard of them, but my great aunt mentioned them the other day.

#### Dear Antoinette.

We no longer observe them in the United States, but Catholics in other countries do.

Ember days are like days of Lent cut out of the Lenten calendar and pasted, three at a time, into other parts of the calendar to mark the four seasons. The ember days are-or were-the Wednesdays, Fridays, and Saturdays after the Memorial of Saint Lucy (December 13), the First Sunday of Lent, Pentecost, and the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross (September 14).

Until the 1960s, in the United States the vigils of great feast days and the ember days were days of fast and abstinence. This obligation has long ceased, and even the memory of these days is almost gone. In some countries where people still live close to the land, they keep ember days, praying for God's goodness to them and their labors.

Unfortunately, in our country almost all sense of a need for days of prayer and penance are gone. Some days still invite such a response from us, like the Feast of the Holy Cross, and the vigils of days like Pentecost, the Immaculate Conception, or the feast day of a saint who is important to us personally.

There are seasons to be kept. Our Christian faith can help us keep the beauty of seasons and days in feasting and in penance and prayer.

# Evening Prayer from The Liturgy of the Hours will be celebrated at 5:30 p.m. each Sunday. For more details, go online to: <u>www.saintmauricebolton.org/other.html</u>.

The Liturgy of the Hours or Divine Office (<u>latin</u> : *liturgia horarum*) is the official set of daily prayers prescribed by the Catholic Church to be recited at the canonical hours the clergy, religious orders and laity. Together with the Mass it constitutes the official public prayer life of the Church. Upon ordination to the Diaconate, the daily recitation of the Liturgy of the Hours becomes a canonical obligation. The Liturgy of the Hours also forms the basis of prayer within Christian monasticism..<sup>[1]</sup>

The Liturgy of the hours, along with the Eucharist, has formed part of the Catholic Church's public worship from the earliest times. Christians of both Eastern and Western traditions (including theCatholic, Eastern Orthodox, Oriental Orthodox, and (Anglican churches) celebrate the Liturgy of the Hours under various names. Within Catholicism, the Liturgy of the Hours is contained within the Roman Breviary.<sup>[2]</sup> In Greek the corresponding services are found in the  $\Box \rho \rho \lambda \delta \gamma \iota ov$  (Horologion)), meaning *Book of Hours*. Within Anglicanism, the Liturgy of the Hours is contained within the book of Daily Prayer of Common Worship and Book of Common Prayer, as well as in the Anglican Breviary. Other names for the Liturgy of the Hours within the Latin Rite include the *Divine Office*, the *Diurnal and Nocturnal Office*, *Ecclesiastical Office*, *Cursus ecclesiasticus*, or simply *cursus*.<sup>[11]</sup>
