I know we're supposed to confess serious sins, but I'm not sure what they are. Is there a list I can check?

Dear Tom.

According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, mortal sin "destroys charity in the heart of man by a grave violation of God's law; it turns man away from God." In other words, grave sin involves violating one of the Ten Commandments. Less serious sin "allows charity to subsist, even though it offends and wounds it" (1855-1858). Venial sin is like a minor heart attack that wounds us, but we're still alive with God. Grave or serious sin is more like a massive heart attack that kills us. A decisive act is required to return us to God's presence.

The Church has tried to move us beyond simple lists of sins. We study Church teaching on the moral life, Scripture, and the Catechism of the Catholic Church to properly form our conscience. We are then able to determine whether we have sinned by reflecting on our actions and on how they affect our relationship with God.

The *Catechism* gives three criteria for a sin to be mortal. First, the subject of the sin must be serious. Second, the person committing the act must do so with full knowledge that the offense is a mortal sin. Third, the person must commit the offense deliberately and freely (1857). While some sins are clearly grave in nature, many of our actions are more personal, and we must look at the entire picture.

The best advice is to celebrate the sacrament of reconciliation on a regular basis and discuss the areas of your life you have questions about with your confessor. It's also a good idea to stay with the same confessor. That way, he can track your progress and offer advice on the areas you have difficulty with.
