#### **EASTER SUNDAY: THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD**

Acts 10:34a, 37-43 / Col 3:1-4 or 1 Cor 5:6b-8 Jn 20:1-9 or Mt 28:1-10 Afternoon or evening Lk 24:13–35

The spring after I bought my first home, my mother and I spent an evening exploring the extensive garden, identifying budding flowers and plants. We discovered a large stone hidden among the leaves of several yucca plants. I wanted to move the stone to a more prominent place, but after one failed attempt to lift the heavy boulder I declared, "That thing isn't moving!" My 71-year-old mother, persistently stubborn, said, "That's ridiculous," and she bent down and lifted the stone herself. I could have fallen over and hit my head on the stone in shock. She was stronger than I was in that moment, stronger than I had imagined she could be.

An even larger and heavier stone rested in front of Jesus' tomb. In Jesus' day, it was common for heavy boulders to be placed in front of tombs to keep out animals and grave robbers. You can imagine the shock of Jesus' followers when they discovered the stone rolled away from the tomb. That was no light stone! Something profound had taken place for it to be moved....something we now know as the resurrection-the miracle of Jesus' triumph over death.

Though we might be hesitant to acknowledge them, we all have heavy stones covering the tombs in our lives. But instead of keeping out intruders, they keep in failures, dead dreams, and unhealed hurts. We may have given up hope and declared about our stones, "That thing isn't moving!" Yet because of Easter, Jesus says to us, "That's ridiculous"-and lifts, rolls, shoves, and explodes our tombstones away.

Jesus' resurrection not only brought us eternal life, but also brings us new life from the tombs of everyday life. He is stronger than we are-stronger even than we've imagined him to be.

## The Sunday after Easter is Divine Mercy Sunday!

How should we prepare for this great Feast of Mercy?

Jesus told St. Faustina that this Feast of Mercy would be a very special day when "**all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened**" (Diary 699) Our Lord made a great promise to all those souls who would go to Confession and then received Him in Holy Communion on the Feast of Mercy, the Sunday after Easter, which is now called Divine Mercy Sunday throughout the Catholic Church.

Jesus promised the "The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain the complete forgiveness of sins and punishment." (Diary 699) He went on to say "I want to grant a complete pardon to the souls that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion on the Feast of My Mercy." (Diary 1109)

We want to encourage everyone to take advantage of this incredible promise and the additional Plenary indulgence on this great Feast of Mercy 'Divine Mercy Sunday'. We want you to benefit fully from these promises, and we also want you to notify all of your family and friends about them too and urge them to return to the practice of their faith!

Jesus said to St. Faustina "I am offering people a vessel with which they are to keep coming for graces to the fountain of mercy. That vessel is the image with the signature: Jesus, I trust in You." The red rays stands for the Blood which is the life of souls. These two rays issued forth from the very depths of My tendy mercy, when My agonized Heart was opened by a lance on the cross...Happy is the one who will dwell in their shelter, for the just hand of God shall not lay hold of him. (Diary 699)

About the feast day "Divine Mercy Sunday," Jesus said "...tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon the souls who approach the Fount of My Mercy. On that day all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened. Le no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet...Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy.

Our Lord said "When you go to confession, to this fountain of My mercy, the Blood and Water which came forth from My Heart always flows down upon your soul..." and "Every time you go to confession, immerse yourself entirely in My mercy with great trust, so that I may pour the bounty of My grace upon your soul. When you approach the confessional, know this, that I myself am waiting there for you. I am only hidden by the priest, but I Myself act in your soul. Here the misery of the soul meets the God of mercy. Make your confession before Me. The person of the priest is...only a screen. Never analyze what sort of a priest that I am making use of; open your soul in confession to Me, and I will fill it with My light. (1725)
