SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER **DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY**

Acts 2:42-47 / 1 Pt 1:3-9 / Jn 20:19-31

Where was Thomas? That's one of those biblical unsolved mysteries. Why wasn't he with the disciples when Jesus first appeared to them? The Gospel states the disciples were together in the locked Upper Room out of fear. Was Thomas not afraid? Was he getting provisions? He's often referred to as "doubting Thomas," but I think of him more as "missing Thomas." Why wasn't he there?

Jesus returns a week later, when Thomas is present. Before Thomas asks, Jesus presents his wounded hands and side as tangible proof of his identity.

Now we find ourselves among those Jesus considers blessed-those who haven't seen him but who believe. But how difficult it can be to live by faith alone! Most of us would leap at the opportunity to see the risen Lord face-toface as Thomas did.

We may not have that experience, but we can take comfort that Thomas did, because Jesus came to him in the way that Thomas needed. Jesus comes to each of us in the personalized way we need him to. The risen Jesus, through the Spirit, is present with us always because he is no longer limited by time or space.

Some people experience Jesus through a mystical vision, others through the unconditional love of a spouse, working closely with the poor, through study and academia, through a deep friendship. Jesus makes himself known to us through our "native language"---in the ways we alone can understand. Because of this, we too can say with the disciples, "I have seen the Lord!"

Arrangements must start more than 6 months before marriage.


CHURCH MEMBERSHIP:

Beatification of Pope John Paul II May 1, 2011

October 22 in 1978 was the day Pope John Paul II was installed as Bishop of Rome, successor of St. Peter, and head of the Universal Church (he had been elected six days earlier, on October 16). On that same day, the opening prayer for the feast day Mass was published. The prayer — called a "collect" — was written in Latin and translated into several languages, including English:

O God, who are rich in mercy and who willed that the Blessed John Paul II should preside as Pope over your universal Church, grant, we pray, that instructed by his teaching, we may open our hearts to the saving grace of Christ, the sole Redeemer of mankind. Who lives and reigns with You, Father Almighty in union with the Holy Spirit. Amen.

This is how Cardinal Angelo Amato, the head of the Congregation for the Causes of Saints in Rome -- the dicastery which oversees all beatification and canonization causes -- explained recently, "Beatification and canonization are not recognitions of someone's superior understanding of theology, nor of the great works he or she accomplished" and the Catholic New Service wrote subsequently "...(Cardinal Amato)..."declaring someone a saint, the Church attests to the fact that he or she lived the Christian virtues in a truly extraordinary way and is a model to be imitated by others... The candidate, he said, must be perceived as an image of Christ.'

But then we might ask: what way did John Paul make clear this holiness?

And we might answer: through his prayer. In other ways as well, but especially through his prayer. Just as Jesus prayed, long and often and alone, so too did John Paul pray long, and often, and alone. John Paul prayed with a fervor and a love of God..."Totus Tuus" meaning he was given over entirely to the love and protection of the Virgin Mary." (May we all follow in his footsteps.)

Truly, this candidate is perceived "as an image of Christ."
