# dear Padre ho is Kateri Tekakwitha?

I've been reading about Kateri Tekakwitha, the first North American Indian to be beatified. She died April 17, 1680, but her feast day is July 14. Why?

#### Margaret

Tekakwitha ("she who puts all things in order") was born in 1656 in the Mohawk settlement at Ossernenon near modern Auriesville, New York. Her mother, an Algonquin Christian named Kahenta, had been taken prisoner in a raid and later married a Mohawk chief.

When Tekakwitha was four, her parents died of smallpox. She recovered from the disease, but it scarred her face and partially blinded her.

When Jesuit missionaries came to the Mohawk settlements, Tekakwitha asked to be baptized as a Christian. This didn't sit well with her community, and she was constantly ridiculed and punished. She was baptized on Easter Sunday in 1676 and given the Christian name Kateri, or Catherine, in honor of Saint Catherine of Siena. She vowed never to marry. When a young brave threatened her, she fled to St. Francis Xavier of Sault St. Louis, near Montreal. There she attended two Masses a day and participated in vespers, rosaries, hymns, and other prayer hours.

On April 17, 1680, Kateri Tekakwitha became ill and died at age 24. She was declared Venerable by Pope Pius XII in 1942 and beatified by Pope John Paul II on June 22, 1980.

For many years, Blessed Kateri Tekakwitha's feast day was the date of her death, but April 17 often falls during Easter Week. In 1982, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops changed it to July 14 so it no longer overlaps with the seasons of Lent or Easter.
