### TWENTY-FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Sir 27:30—28:9 / Rom 14:7-9 / Mt 18:21-35

There's no question that forgiveness is at the heart of today's Scriptures. Sometimes Christians believe that following Jesus simply means being nice or showing kindness. Actually, Jesus' life and teaching focus much more on forgiveness. That's much harder than just being nice, because Jesus demands that we forgive everyone—especially people we dislike or consider to be enemies.

Perhaps the most challenging part of today's readings is that our sins will be forgiven only to the extent that we forgive others'. Sirach says it clearly: "Should a man refuse mercy to his fellows, yet seek pardon for his own sins?" This weekend is a most appropriate time to reflect on forgiveness. Ten years after the 2001 attacks, many of us still harbor anger and hatred toward those who perpetrated the attacks as well as innocent Muslims who had nothing to do with them. Yet, as today's readings remind us, how can we expect God to forgive our sins when we harbor vengeance toward others who have wronged us?

On September 7, 2010, U.S. bishops and other interfaith leaders met "to denounce categorically derision, misinformation and outright bigotry being directed against America's Muslim community.... All acts of intolerance aimed at a religious community should find no place in our world, let alone in our nation which is founded on the principle of religious freedom." It's very clear: Holding grudges, nurturing hatred, and refusing forgiveness are sins, plain and simple. Letting go and offering forgiveness may take a long time, but if we give ourselves to the process, God will help us. True forgiveness is something we rarely can do on our own.

We've covered the Greeting, and the Penitential Act, the next question to be asked is "What are some of <u>major</u> changes?" Well, there are a number of changes within the Gloria. Just enough to make people look at the "pew card" again. Parts of the Mass that we have memorized, will now have to be reexamined one more time and relearned. See below:

### Gloria

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will,

We praise you, we bless you, we glorify you, we give you thanks for your great glory,

Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father,

Lord Jesus Christ, Only begotten Son,

Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father,

you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us;

you take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer;

you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on

For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ,

with the Holy Spirit in the glory of God the Father. Amen

The underlined portion in the above Gloria, is the new revised copy. Some of us are asking why? Well, words affect our lives. How we say and hear words affects how we react to life; the way we live, pray, and believe. The revised translation of the Roman Missal can convey images that can help us express our feelings of praise and thanks to God for all he does for us in many ways.

After praying the same words of the Mass for so many years, both the priest and the people will have the opportunity once again to be more conscious of the words we pray. They will not be words said by rote, but words with a fuller scriptural understanding.
