September 25, 2011 dear Padre Why does God seem to answer some prayers but not others?

My forty-year-old wife was a faith-filled woman who spent most of her life helping others. She died three months ago after a four-year battle with cancer. Many people prayed for her, to no avail. Now she's gone, and people keep telling me to pray. What's the point?

Dear George,

The Church believes that God does get involved in our lives. No, we don't get everything we pray for, even when we are good and faithful. Even Jesus suffered. He cried out, "Father, why have you forsaken me?" But the Father never abandoned the Son. The Father used that suffering and death to reveal his glory and redeem the world. As it says in the Catechism of the Catholic Church,

We firmly believe that God is master of the world and of its history. But the ways of his providence are often unknown to us. Only at the end, when our partial knowledge ceases, when we see God " face to face," will we fully know the ways by which-even through the dramas of evil and sin-God has guided his creation to that definitive sabbath rest for which he created heaven and earth (314).

So even when we don't understand God's will, we are still asked to accept and live it. I urge you to not give up and to pray for strength.

May the Spirit of God enfold and lift you as you entrust your wife to the Lord. And may you trust in the love of God even when all seems lost.

OCTOBER IS THE MONTH OF THE ROSARY

The Blessed Mother gave 15 reassuring promises to St. Dominic for those who faithfully recite the rosary: (1) Whoever shall faithfully serve me by the recitation of the Rosary shall receive signal graces. (2) I promise my special protection and the greatest graces to all those who shall recite the Rosary. (3) The Rosary shall be a powerful armor against hell. It will destroy vice, decrease sin, and defeat heresies. (4) It will cause virtue and good works to flourish; it will obtain for souls the abundant mercy of God; it will withdraw the hearts of people from the love of the world and its vanities, and will lift them to the desire of eternal things. Oh, that souls would sanctify themselves by this means. (5) The soul which recommends itself to me by the recitation of the Rosary shall not perish. (6) Whoever shall recite the Rosary devoutly, applying himself to the consideration of its sacred mysteries, shall never be conquered by misfortune. God will not chastise him in His justice, he shall not perish by an unprovided death; if he be just, he shall remain in the grace of God, and become worthy of eternal life. (7) Whoever shall have a true devotion for the Rosary shall not die without the Sacraments of the Church. (8) Those who are faithful to recite the Rosary shall have during their life and at their death the light of God and the plentitude of His graces; at the moment of death they shall participate in the merits of the Saints in Paradise. (9) I shall deliver from purgatory those who have been devoted to the Rosary. (10) The faithful children of the Rosary shall merit a high degree of glory in Heaven. (11) You shall obtain all you ask of me by the recitation of the Rosary. (12) All those who propagate the Holy Rosary shall be aided by me in their necessities. (13) I have obtained from my Divine Son that all the advocates of the Rosary shall have for intercessors the entire celestial court during their life and at the hour of death. (14) All who recite the Rosary are my children, and brothers and sisters of my only Son, Jesus Christ. (15) Devotion of my Rosary is a great sign of predestination.
