### TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Is 25:6-10a / Phil 4:12-14, 19-20 / Mt 22:1–14 or 22:1–10

Sometimes Jesus' words can seem guite vague to us; at other times, he makes his point with extreme clarity. The latter is the case today. For the past three Sundays, Jesus has used parables to indict the religious leaders for their selfrighteousness, their assumption of God's favor, and their rejection of Jesus. Today he compares them to wedding guests who decline their invitation to attend. Some must see to more important matters; others believe they needn't attend because they're already in the host's good graces.

The story doesn't end well for them, and outsiders accept the invitations. Jesus indicates the religious leaders can't slide by in the Father's eyes—salvation is guaranteed to no one, especially not to those who reject the Father's invitation.

We might too easily dismiss this story as one that doesn't apply to us. We wouldn't reject an invitation to God's banquet. Yet don't we often put other responsibilities and activities before our relationship with God? Don't we sometimes take God's love for granted? "God can't possibly expect us to live as Christians 24/7." "That little lie I told isn't so bad." "God always forgives us, right? We don't have to try that hard."

If those thoughts sound familiar, we have more in common with the invited wedding guests than we thought. Our response to God's invitation should be an ongoing, daily response rather than one given only when it's convenient. We have important responsibilities every day, but we can't accomplish any of them without God-a truth Saint Paul echoed in our second reading: "I have the strength for everything through him who empowers me." With these words first on our lips, we can respondez, s'il vous plaît (RSVP), to God's invitation with a resounding yes-and renewed commitment and conviction.

### THE ROMAN MISSAL cont.

# We left off two weeks ago with "One in being with the Father" is now "Consubstantial with the Father."

Today we address "*Was born of the Virgin Mary.*" You may ask "what's wrong with that?" The new wording is "Was incarnate of the Virgin Mary" This is an important theological term now preserved in the new translation of the Creed's statement about Jesus' unique conception. The older translation referred to the Son in this way: "By the power of the Holy Spirit he was born of the Virgin Mary, and became man." The new translation says that Jesus "by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man."

This phraseology more accurately reflects the Latin text of the Mass, which includes the word *incarnatus* (incarnate"). This theological term refers to "the fact that the Son of God assumed a human nature in order to accomplish our salvation in it" (CCC #461) In the words of John's gospel, "The Word became flesh" (John 1;14) Accordingly, we now say that the Son "by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man." Not only is this a more precise translation, it

also captures more of the theological point expressed in the Creed. The Son of God was not just born of the Virgin Mary; he actually took on human flesh!

## PARENTS CORNER: KIDS AND GOD: If you are starting from scratch

If you're more likely to be doing yard work on Sunday morning than attending Mass, and if most dinners in your house begin without grace, don't worry—you're not alone. But you're not alone either in a desire for a richer faith life for your family. Not sure how to get started? Commit to these four basic items for the school year.

**1.Go to Mass each Sunday:** As Woody Allen said, "Ninety percent of life is just showin up." Get yourself to Mass and see what God has to say to you. Just show up.

2.**Pray with your kids before dinner and bed:** Whether you pray in your own words or use traditional prayers (Bless us, OLord; Hail Mary; Our Father), your children will begin to understand that prayer is important enough that we do it twice a day.

**3.Hang up a cross:** If your house has plenty of artwork and kids' photos on the walls but is lacking a cross, that sends a message to kids about the family's priorities. Get a cross or a crucifix. There are thousands of styles.

**4.Get your kids to religious education:** If your kids are in a Catholic school they're getting several hours of faith formation each week. If not, find a strong Christian formation program that will fit with your family's schedule and commit to it.

### END HOMEWORK BATTLES EARLY

If last school year was a homework nightmare, act fast to put strong practices into place to ensure success. Some tips from families whose homework times are usually peaceful and struggle-free:

**Choose a quiet yet "public" place in the house for home work:** A desk in his or her bedroom might work for an older, self-motivated student, but most kids do better at the dining room table...this fosters more accountability and makes it easier to make sure they are working.

**Give the child responsibility**: Children in grades 2 and up need to understand that homework is their job, not mom or dad's. Kids should start their homework time by reading to you what they have from their assignment notebook. After this initial check-in, children should get to work silently with little discussion. Parents respond to the child's questions in a way that guides the child to the solution without giving away the answer. Parents are available but not sitting with the child.

**Keep homework time focused**: Families with successful students often don't allow video games on school nights. Turn the TV off if anyone in the house is doing homework and keep cell phones away from the teens until homework is complete. In academically oriented families, homework is each night's priority, and other activities are made to fit around homework, not vice versa.
