The Apostles' Creed says Jesus descended into hell before he rose again. What does that mean?

Dear Dan,

Paragraphs 631-658 of the Catechism of the Catholic Church address the phrase you refer to.

In the Creed, "hell" is understood as the realm of all the dead-the abode of both the just and the unjust who have died. Before the coming of Christ, all people who died were deprived of the vision of God. The righteous and the unrighteous alike were cut off from entrance into heaven by the power of sin and death.

But with his death, Christ entered this realm of the dead and defeated its power. Christ entered hell as all who died before him did, yet hell could not hold him or the ones he came to save. Christ opened the gates of heaven and delivered the just from the general kind of hell, while the unjust remain in the hell of the damned.

As the Catechism explains, "By the expression 'he descended into hell,' the Apostles' Creed confesses that Jesus did really die and through his death for us conquered death and the devil."

Only after his descent into and defeat of the realm of the dead was Christ raised up in his resurrected body.
