She's still healthy, but now I'm sick and can no longer care for her. I feel so betrayed. I need God more than ever, but I just don't trust him anymore. Can you help me get over this?

Dear Annette.

I hear my own fears in your anguished words, and I understand your frustration and worry about who will care for your mother.

"Be still and know that I am God!" Those words are from Psalm 46, a prayer that quotes God's fundamental promise: "I am with you." This promise is a gift of his whole person. It requires of us-and this scares me for myself—the gift in return of life and person, body and soul.

But we would rather bargain with God: I'll do this and never do that, and you will help me get my children through school or keep me healthy to care for my aging mother. But God doesn't bargain, and he didn't break a promise to you. You proposed a deal, but God didn't agree to it. Therefore, he hasn't betrayed your

EXCERPT - CATHECHISM FOR CATHOLIC VOTERS – Fr. Stephen F. Torraco, Ph.D.

What if all the candidates from whom I have to choose are pro-abortion? Do I have to abstain from voting at all? What do I do?

Obviously, one of these candidates is going to win the election. Thus, in this dilemma, you should do your best to judge which candidate would do the least moral harm. However, as explained previously, you should not place a candidate who is pro-capital punishment and antiabortion in the same moral category as a candidate who is pro-abortion. Faced with such a set of candidates, there would be no moral dilemma, and the clear moral obligation would be to vote for the candidate who is procapital punishment, not necessarily because he is procapital punishment, but because he is anti-abortion.


