dear Pa When does a sacramental become superstition?

I would call a Saint Joseph statue a sacramental, but it seems to me that burying it in the front yard upside down to make a house sell faster turns it into an object of superstition. Where do we draw the line?

Dear John,

Prayer and sacramentals become objects of superstition when we use them to try to control God. The Catechism of the Catholic Church says, "Sacramentals derive from the baptismal priesthood: every baptized person is called to be a 'blessing,' and to bless" (1669). All the baptized have a right to use sacramentals to ask for God's blessing.

You rightly point out, though, that people get carried away: "If you bury the statue upside down in the front yard, your house will sell." "If you say a Hail Mary every night, you'll find a job." These practices fit the Catechism's definition of superstition: "the deviation of religious feeling and of the practices this feeling imposes....when one attributes an importance in some way magical to certain practices otherwise lawful or necessary" (2111).

The Catechism points out that at times the Church must "purify and correct the religious sense which underlies these devotions so that the faithful may advance in knowledge of the mystery of Christ" (1676). The Church must remind people not to use sacramentals and prayer to convince God to do what you want him to do, but rather to ask his blessing.

EXCERPT - CATHECHISM FOR CATHOLIC VOTERS – Fr. Stephen F. Torraco, Ph.D.

What about elected officials who happen to be of the same party affiliation? Are they committing a sin by being in the same party, even if they don't advocate pro-choice views? Are they guilty by association?

Being of the same political party as those who advocate proabortion is indeed a serious evil **IF** I belong to this political party IN ORDER TO ASSOCIATE MYSELF with that party's advocacy of pro-abortion policies. However, it can also be true that being of such a political party has as its purpose to change the policies of the party. Of course, if this is the purpose, one would have to consider whether it is reasonable to think the political party's policies can be changed. Assuming that it is reasonable to think so, then it would be morally justifiable to remain in that political party.

Defending Our Religious Liberty

As stated on the website for the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), beware of claims especially by partisans, that bishops are partisan. Bishops have formed their position opposing the federal healthcare mandate based on principles – in this case, religious liberty for all and for the life and dignity of every human person.
