September 8, 2013 TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Wis 9:13-18b / Phlm 9-10, 12-17 / Lk 14:25-33

I love following a recipe that leads to a beautiful, delicious dish, but I often make a very amateurish move—I start cooking without first reading the recipe to the end. I'll start to sauté the onions and garlic and then discover I should have marinated the chicken overnight.

The tower-builder and king in today's gospel sound like me. But Jesus was talking about something far more serious—the requirements for discipleship. He suspected the large crowds following him didn't know what they were getting into. They hadn't read the whole discipleship recipe, which included carrying your cross, leaving family members behind, and renouncing possessions. For many, these requirements were too much.

Have you read the Recipe for Discipleship? Here are some of the instructions:

- Make God your first priority—not your money, family, or schedule.
- · Carry your cross every day without complaining.
- · Discard possessions that possess you.
- · Give generously.
- · Marinate your heart in forgiveness.
- · You aren't the center of your world. Others are.
- Be grateful.
- · Believe in God even when all you feel is doubt.
- Be prepared to lay down your life—for a friend and for the Lord.

Jesus challenges us to read the whole recipe and still commit wholeheartedly to discipleship. The result is more beautiful than a decadent cheesecake or the finest beef bourguignon. It's the kingdom of God—and eternal life.


