Is 11:1-10 / Rom 15:4-9 / Mt 3:1-12

About this time of year, nearly everyone is preparing to visit or be visited as families gather for traditional Christmas preparations, concerts, and meals. At our house, we also make way for those who have no one to visit—whether because of distance or circumstance.

I wonder, though, whether we'd welcome a stranger or someone who challenged the way we live or think about things. Paul tells everyone to welcome one another and to glorify God with one voice.

That's easier when everyone thinks alike. Not all of us want to reflect on the possibility that we may be wrong.

This is the issue facing the religious leaders when John the Baptist bursts onto the scene, calling on everyone to repent and prepare for the kingdom of God. John recognizes that they came to him for show—not because they sought repentance for sin. He wastes no time demanding evidence of the "good fruit" repentance brings and warning about the consequences if it's not forthcoming.

John is a challenging guest for us as well. Sometimes we want to dictate the outcome of our discussion and our lives, but John demands that we show the fruit of our efforts. It's not enough to go through the motions of living faithfully—we must give our very selves over to the will of God and the conversion of our lives.

Only then can we welcome everyone in love and in the praise of God.

#### THE MEANING OF ADVENT

Advent is the beginning of a new liturgical year for the Roman Catholic Church. The season of Advent begins 4 Sundays before Christmas. The four candles of the Advent Wreath represent the four weeks of Advent. The four outer candles represent the period of waiting during the four weeks of Advent, which themselves symbolize four centuries of waiting between the prophet Malachi and the birth of Christ. The word Advent comes from the Latin word *adventus*, which means "to come



to". Some of the symbols of Advent are the Advent Candles and Advent Wreath. The Advent Wreath, circular in shape, with no beginning and no end, symbolizes eternal life through Jesus, our Savior. The wreath has four outer candles, and one inner. The outer are lit in sequence over the four Sundays. The 3 outer purple

candles, along with purple vestment worn by the priest, represent the royalty and majesty of Jesus Christ as King of Kings. They also represent the *Candles of Hope*, *of Love*, and *of Peace*, as well as our preparation, prayer, penitence and good works during this time. The rose (pink) candle, the *Candle of Joy*, lit the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday, along with rose colored vestment, takes a break midway during this season and characterizes the joyful expectation to come. The central white candle, the *Christ Candle*, is lit on the Vigil and Christmas Day Masses. The *Christ Candle* symbolizes Jesus Christ as the *Light of the World*, and its center placement reminds us that Jesus always should be at the center of our lives.


