## March 2, 2014 EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (A)

Is 49:14-15 / 1 Cor 4:1-5 / Mt 6:24-34

"Jesus loves me, this I know."

We nod our heads when asked whether God loves us, but what would you say if you were asked, "Does God like you?"

God's love is often difficult to fathom. Some of us are rational: "God loves everyone"—the unspoken thought being, "It's his job to love me." We say this about parents as well: "She's my mom, she has to say that." This idea of God's love never moves further than the head.

Other people compartmentalize the love: "God loves me, but only when I'm good" or "God loves only the good parts of me." Still others use God's love as a shield against responsibility: "God forgives me no matter what I do and would never judge me harshly." God becomes a marshmallow—all sugar, no nutrition.

In reality, God's love holds us in delight as parents delight in their children. God's love rejoices in us as the Creator rejoices in endless variety and hidden mystery.

God's love doesn't come out of necessity. Rather, it springs out of the nature of God. Out of love, God holds us accountable for our actions, forgives us when we ask, and is an abiding presence whether we recognize it or not. When we turn away, God is there. When we suffer, God walks with us. When we sin, God is the source of our conversion.

God grounds us in peace and joy. God doesn't love us because we are the greatest and best—in that case, none of us would be worthy. God simply loves.

We have only to seek his righteousness to know that and believe it.

OPERATION RICE BOWL: OUR LENTEN PROGRAM: FOR LENT, FOR LIFE -- On Ash Wednesday, March 5, 2014, our parish with parishes across the Diocese of Norwich is beginning a program of prayer and sacrifice called Operation Rice Bowl (ORB). For 41 years, Operation Rice Bowl has helped to feed the hungry poor. Through our participation in this program, we bring hope and healing to another person or family living halfway across the globe, strengthen and enriching those persons' lives, both physically and spiritually, and greatly enhancing your parish community's Lenten faith experience. Rice bowls will be available at the Ushers' table. Families are encouraged to gather each week in prayer for the hungry poor and to share a sacrificial meal. With the moneys saved from this meal, a donation is placed in the family Rice Bowl and can be brought to the parish family Rice Bowl on Palm Sunday, April 1, 2012. 75% of Operation Rice Bowl funds will feed the hungry poor overseas, the remaining 25% will be used in the diocese to feed the needy. This Lent, gather in prayer and sacrifice as a family to pray and to care for the hungry poor.

# WHERE ARE CONTRIBUTIONS TO OPERATION RICE BOWL USED?

Operation Rice Bowl receives all of its support from individual and family contributions. Catholic Relief Services, the official overseas aid and development agency of American Catholics, used 75% of all contributions for development projects\* overseas. 25% of the moneys collected remain in the local diocese where they are used to support projects assisting the needy.

\*Projects include agriculture projects to help farmers improve crop yields and increase food security; water projects to make clean water accessible for communities; microfinance projects to encourage the growth of small businesses; mother and child projects to provide basic health and nutrition education for families: and education projects to provide participants with opportunities to improve their livelihoods.

#### GENERAL INFORMATION FOR THE OBSERVANCE OF LENT

#### **FAST AND ABSTINENCE**

These regulations unite the whole Catholic Church throughout the world in the Lenten journey of repentance and conversion of heart. Observed in a spirit of generosity, fast and abstinence remind us of our own frailty and make us more sensitive to the needs of others. Acts of penance find their completion in works of charity and justice.

**Fasting:** Those between the ages of 18 and 59 years old are obliged to observe the laws on fasting. Traditionally, to fast means limiting oneself to one full meal in the day and two smaller meals. The two prescribed days of fasting are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

**Abstinence**: The law of abstinence obliges all those who are over the age of 14. On days of abstinence meat is not eaten at any meal. The prescribed days of abstinence are Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent, including Good Friday.


