The apostles said to the Lord, "Increase our faith." The Lord replied, "If you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you would say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you." - Lk 17:5-6

As adults, unless we are dealing with children, "obedience" is not a word we typically like to hear. It often brings connotations of military protocols, deference to superiors at work, or conforming to laws and practices. In a culture that has learned to challenge authority, being obedient is understood more as something I "have" to do, not "want" to do. Do you ever see merit in wanting to be obedient? Encouraged to develop independent, self-sufficient egos and personas, we learn to focus on our own wills and merits as we strive for success and achieve a sense of well-being. Giving ourselves over to the will of another, especially when done blindly, can sometimes carry more risk than we are willing to take. Also, blindly following orders without any deference to ethics or morality can lead to atrocious crimes

St. Ignatius of Loyola states, "There are three sorts of obedience; the first, obedience when a strict obligation is imposed upon us, and this is good; the second when the simple word of the superior, without any strict command, suffices for us, and this is better; the third, when a thing is done without waiting for an express command, from a knowledge that it will be pleasing to the superior, and this is the best of all." St. Ignatius sees obedience as an act of love. When the person we are obeying genuinely has our best interest in mind, acting themselves with love and integrity, then what St. Ignatius says makes excellent sense. When mutual trust and a bond of love and respect are present, obedience can lead to freedom and truth.

We ask God to increase our faith. In other words, increase our trust that God knows best how to live and act in this world. We desire the same confidence, determination, and patience Jesus had that the fulfillment of God's vision would one day come. Nurturing a deep love of God and trusting in his providence, we obediently do what we know is pleasing to God: love, repent of sin, show mercy, be compassionate and fight injustice. As we willingly give witness to our faith, we do only what we are obliged to do, expecting nothing in return. Spared from the task of having to figure it all out for ourselves, we discover freedom.

OCTOBER ROSARY RALLY

The Catholic Church dedicates the month of October to the Holy Rosary. At St. Maurice, we started an October tradition of honoring Our Lady by gathering as a group in the church, and reciting the 4 Mysteries of the Rosary (Joyful, Luminous, Sorrowful, and Glorious). This year, the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary, falls on the First Friday of the Month.

At 6 pm, we will begin reciting 3 Mysteries, followed by Mass at 7 pm and Adoration at 7:30 pm. During Adoration, the 4th Mystery will be recited.

The intentions for this Rosary Rally are for the legal defense and protection of all human life, an end to the war in Ukraine, restoration of our nation and world back to God, and YOUR personal intentions. Let us draw closer to Jesus and Mary by meditating on the mysteries of our salvation.

Safe Environments Abuse Prevention Training

In the Diocese of Norwich, all volunteers who have regular contact with minors, all employees, all clergy, and all religious, are required to complete safe environments training. This training is monitored by the Office for Safe Environments (OSE) In addition, this training is also available to any parishioner, or parent of a parochial school child, regardless of whether or not they wish to volunteer at their parish or school. It contains important information about keeping our children and youth safe.

The Diocese of Norwich offers two Praesidium programs. Both cover the same material, just in different formats. You can take the on-line program, *Praesidium*, or attend a one-time DVD presentation, Called to Protect.

The in person *Called to Protect* training classes have been postponed until further notice. Praesidium on line is available and the preferred training at this time. For more information about in person training availability, contact the **OSE**.

The OSE can be contacted to provide adult programs for parents, parishioners and all interested in keeping our youth safe, such as Setting Boundaries. A convenient time can be arranged. Please contact the Child Advocate at your parish or school office in order to be enrolled, or for more information.

Our children's safety is the responsibility of all Catholics.

LEARN MORE ABOUT THE EUCHARIST

The Eucharistic Revival - The Eucharist, did you know?

What do we mean by presence? In its most general sense, presence means being with another. We all experience presence in several familiar ways. It might be local, when we are in the same physical place as another. It can also be temporal, when we are with another at the same time. Local and temporal presence usually go together, but sometimes we can be temporally present to another without being physically with them, for example when talking over the phone or via the internet. A third kind of presence might be called personal - how we experience "being with" another person – even when that person is not physically with us but is with us through our memory, imagination or emotions.

Why is personal presence different from local and temporal presence? Personal presence often goes beyond the experience of just being with another in a certain place and time. In these two types of presence, our senses are always engaged. But personal presence goes beyond sense perception. When someone lives far away from us or when a loved one dies, for example, that person can continue to be present with us when we remember the person, recall their words to us, or let the feeling of their presence affect us. Personal presence, because it goes beyond what the senses provide, relies on an inner or spiritual connection and so is most like what we experience in relation to God. This kind of personal connection allows us to have a spiritual experience of God's presence - a presence that goes beyond anything our physical senses can detect.

Why is God present to us? The only explanation is that God loves us and wants to be in a relationship with us. Like every personal relationship, the partners freely choose not just to be present locally or temporally, but to open up their inner selves to one another through communication that leads to deeper communion. God chooses to be with us so that we can participate in God's own life and so live beyond our death in an eternal life of loving relationship. By our sharing in the intimate communion of Christ with us in the Eucharist as our food, we nourish ourselves and become united to God for eternal life.


