I confess that I have a soft spot for the scary things Jesus says because they are usually ignored. But there's gold in them thar hills, if we have courage to look. This week Jesus gives us a terrifying warning in his parable about the king who gives a marriage feast for his son and promptly goes berserk when people don't respond. The point: those who do not properly respond to God's generous invitation will face totally devastating consequences. The invitees who don't show up get their city burned to the ground. The poor homeless man is tortured for not wearing the correct clothes. Scary indeed.

Is Jesus trying to intimidate or bully us into following him? No, because that is certainly not how he treats anyone in the Gospels. A better view is this: to Jesus, your life *matters*. The universe is not an empty wasteland where anything goes. It is a theater of love offered and either accepted or rejected. How easy it can be to glide through life thinking my life doesn't make a difference. But it does. It really does.

This should not only be sobering but exhilarating. The positive side of the negative in Jesus' scary parables is the thrill and joy that he is inviting us, therefore our lives matter a great deal. There *is* a reason to get up in the morning. God's generous love is relentlessly calling us. True, obstinately saying no through our indifference is a catastrophe for us and those around us. But how wonderful must the consequences of our 'yes' be?


<u>Pray the Project Rachel Rosary at the Cathedral</u> of St. Patrick-Norwich



October 15 is National Pregnancy and Infant Loss Remembrance Day. It was established in 2002 and passed in the United States House of Representatives in 2006, to honor, celebrate, and remember babies who have passed away due to miscarriage, still-birth, neonatal death, and other causes of infant loss. The aim of this day is to raise awareness of the estimated 1 in 4 individuals and families whose lives are altered by the death of their children, during pregnancy, at birth and in infancy.

Below is a prayer written by Mother Angelica, a sister of the Poor Clares of Perpetual Adoration and founder of the Eternal Word Television Network, EWTN. It was written to comfort parents who have suffered a pregnancy or infant loss.

Prayer by Mother Angelica

My Lord, my baby is dead! Why, my Lord – dare I ask why? My child will not hear the whisper of the wind or see the beauty of its parents' face – he/she will not see the beauty of Your creation or the flame of a sunrise. Why, my Lord?

"Why, My child — I will tell you why. You see, the child lives. Instead of the wind your child hears the sound of angels singing before My throne. Instead of the beauty that passes, your child sees everlasting Beauty — your child sees My face. Your child was created and lived a short time so the image of his/her parents imprinted on his/her face may stand before Me as their personal intercessor. Your child laughs with a special joy that only the innocent possess. My ways are not the ways of humans. I create for My Kingdom and each creature fills a place in that Kingdom that could not be filled by another. Your child was created for My joy and his/her parents' merits. Your child has never seen pain or sin. He/She has never felt hunger or pain. I breathed a soul into a seed, made it grow and called it forth."

All women in the Diocese of Norwich are invited to join the Norwich Diocesan Council of Catholic Women (NDCCW), Membership is only \$5.00 a year. Our Membership Drive runs through the month of October. NDCCW was started in 1955 by Bishop Bernard J. Flanagan, the first Bishop of Norwich. Bishop Flanagan designated the NDCCW as the official women's organization of the Diocese. The money collected through the Membership Drive is divided up as follows: 60% of all dues collected is given to Catholic Charities; 15% of what is collected in each deanery is kept in that district (it is used for operating expenses); 20% of what is collected in the Diocese is given to the Diocesan Council for the operating expenses; 5% of the total collected is sent to the National Council of Catholic Women. NDCCW and its seven districts are all affiliated with the National Council of Catholic Women. You may drop your membership envelope in any collection basket. If your parish does not have NDCCW membership envelope in it, simply write your name, email address, pone number, and the name of the parish you belong along with the city or town it is located in and mark it NDCCW. Thank you, hope you will join us.


