## MINUTES OF THE ST. MAURICE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING of April 10, 2018

1. The meeting was called to order at 7:10 p.m. Tom Manning opened the meeting with a prayer.

- 2. Minutes of the February 13, 2018 meeting were approved as distributed. The March meeting was cancelled due to inclement weather.
- 3. Financial report by Mike Harney: Items of Significance compared to the 9 month period ending 3/31/17.
  - a. Revenue
    - i. Offertory collections are \$5,700 behind last year; 4.8%
    - ii. Fuel collection off \$3,400; 34.4%
    - iii. Christmas & Holy Days are up \$2,600; 86%
    - iv. Memorial Donations total \$1,015 against \$0 last year
    - v. Ordinary revenue \$6,400 below; 4.8%
  - b. Expenses
    - i. Church/Altar supplies up \$2,850; 161%
    - ii. Food & household expenses up \$1,400; 22%
    - iii. Heat is \$2,600 over last year; 24% trending to a 30% increase by year end
    - iv. Electricity up \$700; 12%
    - v. General supplies \$1,400 higher; 111%
    - vi. Repairs & maintenance is lower by \$1,600; 10%
    - vii. Transportation is \$1,500 above last year; 42%
    - viii. Compensation extra priests is down by \$2,650; 71%
    - ix. Total Expenses are \$6,900 higher; 4.6%
  - c. Net Income is \$19,355 which is \$11,100 worse than last year. Trending toward a possible net loss of approximately \$23,000.
    - i. Discussion included projections, based on previous 6 years, of a net loss of \$16,800.
    - ii. Previous fiscal year loss was \$12,000.
    - iii. Total assets of \$108,000 indicate an ability to cover losses for another 5 to 6 years, depending on capital expenditures.
- 4. Faith Formation report was given by Tom Manning as follows:
  - a. Confirmation was administered on Saturday, March 10 at the Cathedral in Norwich. Despite the distance, this was very successful.
  - b. There are three more sessions. We are preparing for next year. A draft schedule and registration forms are being reviewed.
  - c. A Youth Mass will be celebrated on April 29.
  - d. The May Crowning will be at the 10:00 Mass on May 13.
  - e. First Reconciliation and First Communion are scheduled for May 19 and May 20, 2018.

- 5. Lou Cloutier reported on Property Management as follows:
  - a. The double doors at opposite ends of the corridor in the lower level of the Parish Center have been replaced.
  - b. Windows on the South Side of the Parish Center will be replaced after the Fair. One is broken. Cost estimate is \$10,000.
  - c. Round tables in the Parish Center have been cleaned.
  - d. The stoves, hoods, and floor in the kitchen have been cleaned.
  - e. Estimated cost to replace the two identification signs out front is \$7,000.
  - f. The clothing shed for donations to WAIM has been replaced.
  - g. The water system at the Rectory has been upgraded with filters and water softener.
  - h. The wood deck in the front of the Parish Center needs repair. This is a potential Eagle Scout project.
- 6. Tony Girasoli reported on activities of the Knights of Columbus. The Spring Fling will be held on April 21.
- 7. Seasonal Sharing for Easter took place on March 25.
- 8. The Parish survey has been carried out. Kathy Perlitz will discuss the results with Father Leon. New Commissions are being formed. Other new business discussed:
  - a. Need for a second Trustee.
  - b. Need for a new Parish Directory.
  - c. Participation in the 300<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration of the Town of Bolton in 2020.

The meeting adjourned at 7:57 p.m. The next meeting will be held May 8, 2018.
