Genesis 14

- 17 When Abram returned from his victory over Chedorlaomer and the kings who were allied with him, the king of Sodom went out to greet him in the Valley of Shaveh (that is, the King's Valley).
- 18 Melchizedek, king of Salem, brought out bread and wine, and being a priest of God Most High, he blessed Abram with these words:
- 19 Blessed be Abram by God Most High, the creator of heaven and earth;
- 20 And blessed be God Most High, who delivered your foes into your hand." Then Abram gave him a tenth of everything.

Deuteronomy 14

- 22 "Each year you shall tithe all the produce that grows in the field you have sown;
- 23 then in the place which the LORD, your God, chooses as the dwelling place of his name you shall eat in his presence your tithe of the grain, wine and oil, as well as the firstlings of your herd and flock, that you may learn always to fear the LORD, your God.
- 24 If, however, the journey is too much for you and you are not able to bring your tithe, because the place which the LORD, your God, chooses for the abode of his name is too far for you, considering how the LORD has blessed you,
- 25 you may exchange the tithe for money and, with the purse of money in hand, go to the place which the LORD, your God, chooses.

- 26 You may then exchange the money for whatever you desire, oxen or sheep, wine or strong drink, or anything else you would enjoy, and there before the LORD, your God, you shall partake of it and make merry with your family.
- 27 But do not neglect the Levite who belongs to your community, for he has no share in the heritage with you.
- 28 "At the end of every third year you shall bring out all the tithes of your produce for that year and deposit them in community stores,
- 29 that the Levite who has no share in the heritage with you, and also the alien, the orphan and the widow who belong to your community, may come and eat their fill; so that the LORD, your God, may bless you in all that you undertake.

Malachi 3

- 6 Surely I, the LORD, do not change, nor do you cease to be sons of Jacob.
- 7 Since the days of your fathers you have turned aside from my statutes, and have not kept them. Return to me, and I will return to you, says the LORD of hosts. Yet you say, "How must we return?"
- 8 Dare a man rob God? Yet you are robbing me! And you say, "How do we rob you?" In tithes and in offerings!
- 9 You are indeed accursed, for you, the whole nation, rob me.
- 10 Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house, and try me in this, says the LORD of hosts: Shall I not open for you the floodgates of heaven, to pour down blessing upon you without measure?
- 11 For your sake I will forbid the locust to destroy your crops; And the vine in the field will not be barren, says the LORD of hosts.
- 12 Then all nations will call you blessed, for you will be a delightful land, says the LORD of hosts.

Matthew 5

5 **Blessed are the meek**, for they will inherit the land.

Psalm 37

- 8 Give up your anger, and forsake wrath; be not vexed, it will only harm you.
- 9 For evildoers will be cut off, but those who wait for the Lord will possess the land.
- 10 Yet a little while, and the wicked man shall be no more; though you mark his place he will not be there.
- 11 But the meek shall possess the land, they shall delight in abounding peace.

Step 3 – Blessed are the Meek

The Greek word used for "meek" does not mean "weak, spineless, feeble, lifeless, or dreary." It is not the oily cringing of Dickens' Uriah Heep, who constantly describes himself as "your humble servant." Rather it means "gentle, considerate, and unassuming." It means "broken," not in the sense of destroyed or shattered, but in the sense that a horse is broken when it is tamed: strength under submission.

Moses is described as "very meek, more than all men that were on the face of the earth". Moses was hardly a weak and spineless leader! But all the force of his character was held in place by God.

The preacher and writer Dr. Martyn Lloyd-Jones defined meekness as "essentially a true view of oneself, expressing itself in attitude and conduct with respect to others." He goes on further to say:

The man who is meek is not even sensitive about himself. He is not always watching himself and his own interests. He is not always on the defensive. We all know about this, do we not? Is not one of the greatest curses in life as a result of the Fall – this sensitivity about self? We spend the whole of our lives watching ourselves. But when a man becomes meek he has finished with all that; he no longer worries about himself and what other people say. To be truly meek means we no longer protect ourselves, because we see there is nothing worth defending. So we are not on the defensive; all that is gone. The man who is truly meek never pities himself, he is never sorry for himself.

He goes on to quote John Bunyan: "He that is down need fear no fall."

When we are in this position Jesus says we will "inherit the earth". Everything we receive is a gift because we know we don't deserve it. When we reach this state we are in a position to know how to receive what God wants to give, both in this life and the life to come – He will give us everything.

Gifts of the Holy Spirit

Isaiah 11

- 24 For Wisdom is mobile beyond all motion, and she penetrates and pervades all things by reason of her purity.
- 25 For she is a breath of the might of God and a pure emanation of the glory of the Almighty; therefore nothing defiled can enter into her.
- For she is the reflection of eternal light, the spotless mirror of the power of God, the image of his goodness.
- 27 Although she is one, she can do all things, and she renews everything while herself perduring; passing into holy souls from age to age, she produces friends of God and prophets.
- For God loves nothing so much as the one who dwells with Wisdom.

Proverbs 3

- 13 Happy the man who finds wisdom, the man who gains understanding!
- 14 For her profit is better than profit in silver, and better than gold is her revenue;
- 15 She is more precious than corals, and none of your choice possessions can compare with her.
- 16 Long life is in her right hand, in her left are riches and honor;
- 17 Her ways are pleasant ways, and all her paths are peace;
- 18 She is a tree of life to those who grasp her, and he is happy who holds her fast.

Fruits of the Holy Spirit

Galatians 5

- 23 gentleness (or humility), self-control. Against such there is no law.

Jealousy of Aaron and Miriam.

- 1 Miriam and Aaron spoke against Moses on the pretext of the Cushite woman he had married; for he had in fact married a Cushite woman.
- 2 They complained, "Is it through Moses alone that the LORD has spoken? Has he not spoken through us also?" And the LORD heard this.
- 3 Now the man Moses was very humble, more than anyone else on earth.
